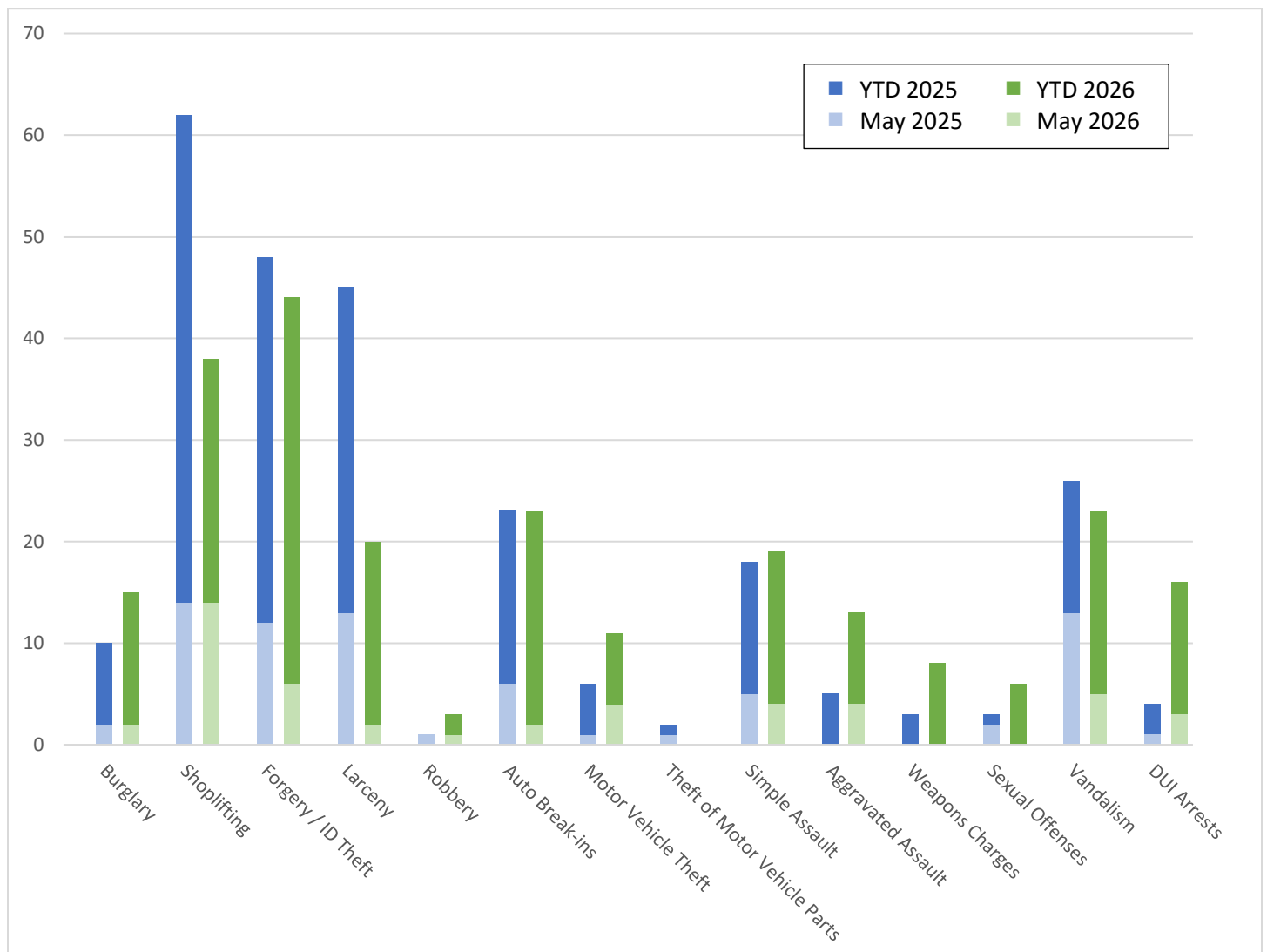

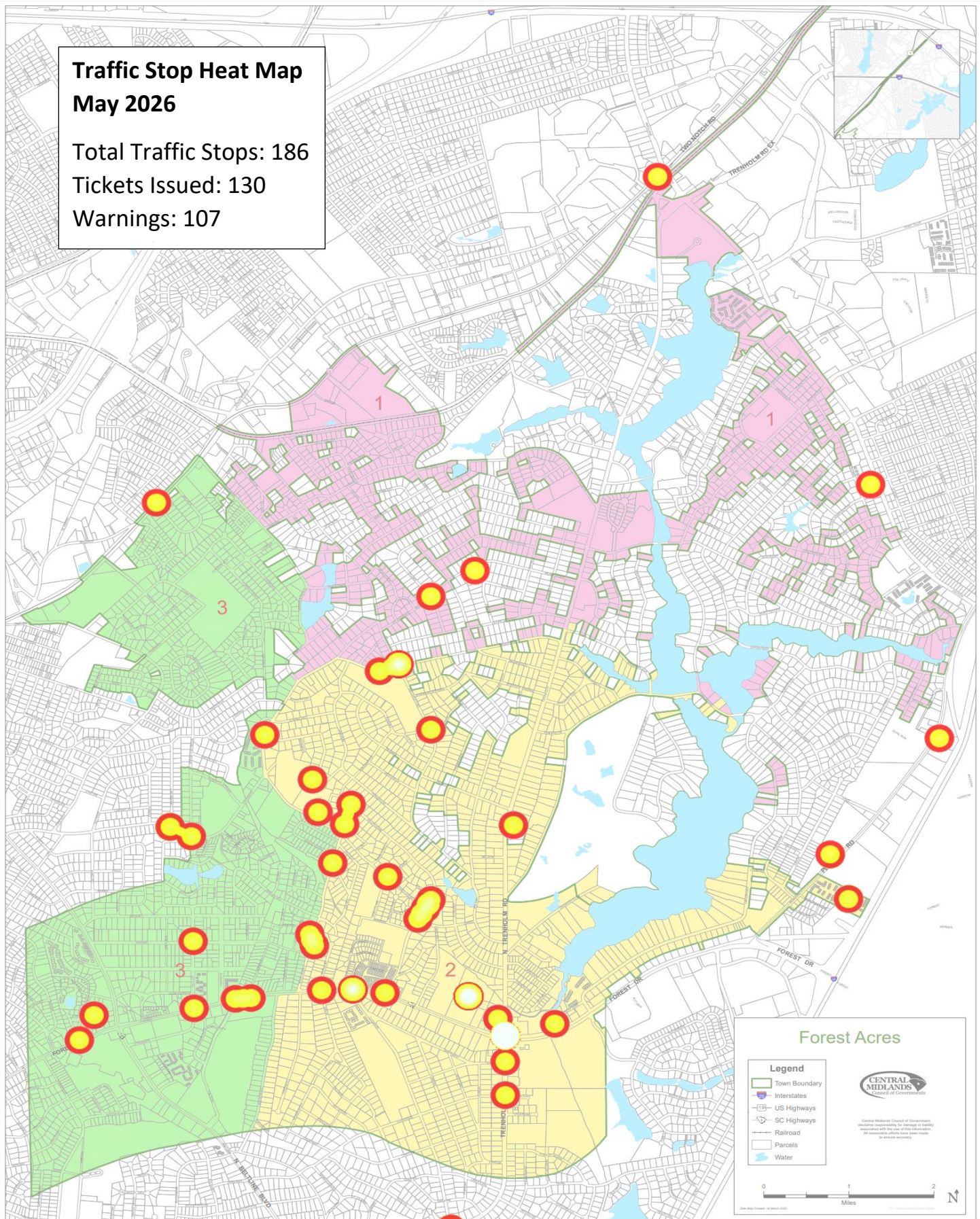

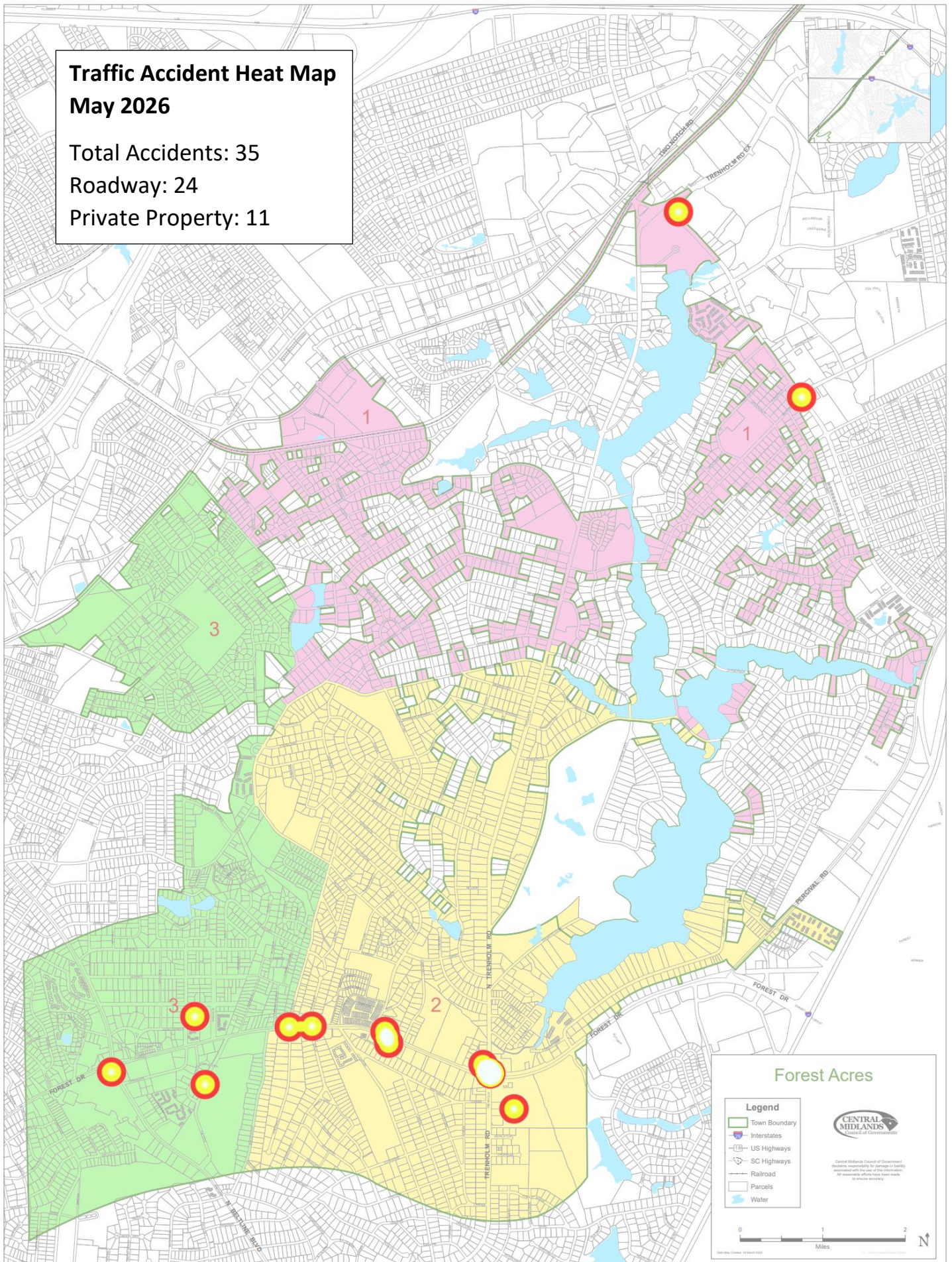


Traffic Accident Heat Map May 2026

Accident Summary

- 35 total accidents in the month.
- 5 fewer than last month.
- 24 Roadway Accidents (29 last month).
- 11 Private Property (same as last month).
- Primary Causes of roadway accidents were **Failure to Yield** (8), **Followed Too Close** (7), **Improper Lane Change** (3).
- Primary Causes of private property accidents were **Improper Backing** (4), and **Improper Turn** (4).
- 8 of the roadway accidents happened on Forest Dr., 6 on N. Trenholm Rd., and 3 on Decker Blvd.
- 6 of the 11 private property accidents happened at businesses on Forest Drive.
